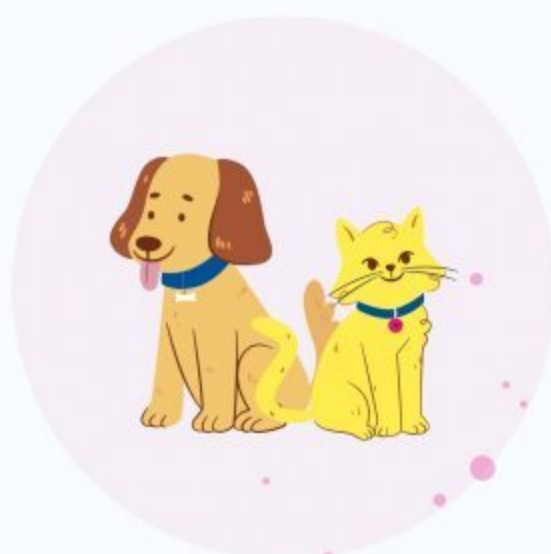


The Dust In Your Home Comes From These 6 Places!

Four-legged members of your household can also be a source of dust. Not only dander but also bits of dried saliva ends up as dust!



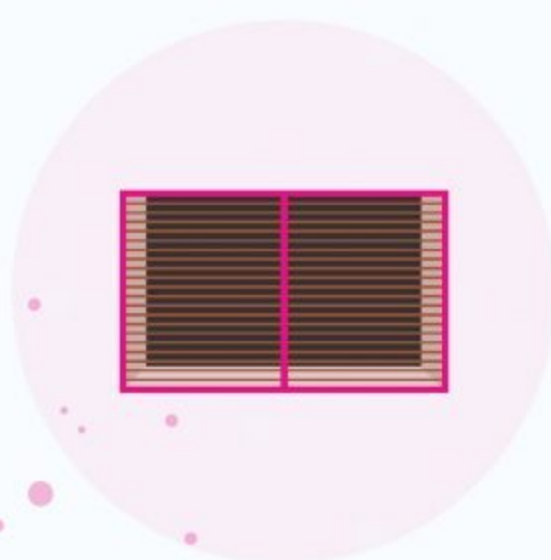
Household pests

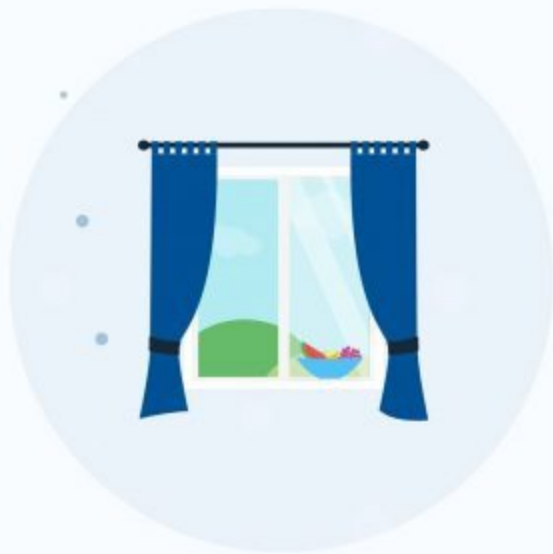
HVAC ducts and small gaps
